New Years Resolutions

New Year's Eve is followed by a day of resolution. On January 1st of each year many of us resolve to do better in the following 364 days, and some of us because of our actions in the previous year, have lists as long as the New York City voters list. However, sportsmen and conservationists throughout this District are general a pretty ethical group of individuals, and their resolution lists are usually always very short.

Therefore, to assist the many thousands of anglers and hunters in this District to pad their list for 1957, we are providing a number of resolutions which can be used:

I RESOLVE THAT IN 1957:

- 1. I will use a hunting dog for ducks, upland birds and small game, so that I retrieve all dead or crippled animals, and so that I may improve my hunting and my enjoyment of it.
- 2:. I will not shoot ducks in semi-darkness either in the morning or evening, even though I am within the half hour legal limit, so that I do not lose any game.
- 3. I will learn the lethal range of my shotgun so that I will not cripple any game which is out of range.
- 4. I will obey the ten commandments of hunting safety, so that neither my friends nor I will become part of the hunting fatality statistics.
- 5. I will always ask the permission of the landowners on whose land I hunt or fish.
- 6. I will try to improve the area on which I hunt or the stream in which I fish.

- If I cannot be honestly proud of the sporting manner in which I sheot any game, I will not aboot.
- I will clean my game or fish as soon as possible and eat it before it loses it's flavour, and will not waste any part.
- I will fish more often in more ways, for instance ice-fishing this winter, coarse fish spearing, smelt seining this winter and spring, fly-fishing in May, trolling and casting this summer.
- I will fish for all species of fish, and use the gear which will give me the most enjoyment.
- I will eat every species of fish I catch and learn that nongame species are delicious as well as game fish.
- I will give my wife a good cook book or recipe book for cooking game-fish on the first holiday, birthday, or anniversay she may have ĭn **1**957.
- 13. I will play each fish I catch until I have defeated him and can land him easily.
- 14. While I fish or hunt, I will also enjoy myself outdoors by learning more about the birds, mammals, trees, shrubs, and herbs of the area.
- I will take an active part in conserving Ontario's resources, as a members of a group or as an individual.
- I will learn to preserve those resources which require preservation, and learn to use those resources which require using.
