Our Purpose


- •To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and game.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Attention All Members

It was brought to the attention of the Executive that we as a club may be falling behind in our pledge to "Obey all Fish and Game Laws".

Boating and canoeing have been a major part of our Club's activities for many years.

Since the year 2009, it is law that everyone that operates a watercraft under motor power must have in his or her possession a valid Safe Boaters Card. This means a watercraft with an electric motor, as most of us do use.

If your impression is that because we are on private waters, a Safe Boaters Card is not required, then you are mistaken. If you do not have a card, then I suggest you obtain one as soon as possible. A check system will be put in place, (Card shown at time of renewal) to comply with our liabilities.

Now, for those of you that operate a boat or canoe without a motor you also have responsibilities. In <u>every</u> watercraft on the lake there must be properly sized life jackets for everyone in the boat and they should be worn. Also needed is a signaling device, a bailing device, a towrope and an anchor. It would be wise to check out the Government of Canada web site for full requirements, as they will be enforced.

Please take this as an official notice from your Executive, that anyone not complying will be asked to take their craft out of the water until all conditions are met.

As a final note the Club has in its possession a number of life jackets that we do not need, if anyone would like some for their water craft please call me (519-668-2609) and I will assist in getting them for you. There is a limited number, so first come gets them. Just a reminder that a life jacket must be sized for the individual wearing it and the size rating is located on the inside of the life jacket.

I would like to thank one of our Past Presidents, John Mavell for officiating at the Elections on March 11.
