President's Message

August 2005

It has been a very hot summer this year and I hope that everyone is enjoying it despite the extreme heat and humidity at times.

Some members have expressed their concerns about not catching as many bass this year as in previous years, although they are still caught. There could be many reasons for this phenomenon. First, the bass are there but not interested in the bait or lure offered by the angler. Remember that fish are attracted to lures and bait that are similar to what they are currently eating. Secondly, the bass could have gone deeper, due to the hot weather, where the water is cooler. Another possibility is that the number of bass has reduced due to the natural processes of Mother Nature or they may have been over fished. Some of these possibilities were discussed at the July Executive meeting. We will be following up with discussions from other groups to see if they have observed the same thing in the waters in their area and will keep the members informed of any developments.

Remember - Bass are catch and release at WOFGPA.

As you continue to enjoy the last half of the summer, please remember to use sun block and insect repellant, stay hydrated, wear your life jacket while on the water and always make sure that there is a worm on your hook. Happy angling.

Chili Sauce

(Makes 8 pints)

heaping 6 qt basket of ripe tomatoes (peeled and chopped)

2 cups of each:

diced celery, red peppers, green peppers, cooking onions

- 3 cups brown sugar
- 2 cups white vinegar
- 4 Tablespoons pickling salt
- 1 teaspoon of each:

ground allspice, cinnamon powder and ground cloves

½ teaspoon ginger powder

Combine tomatoes, peppers, celery and onions in large pot. Heat to boil and continue for 1 to 1½ hours. At this point, you may want to drain off some of the excess juice (the juice can be used as a pretty decent soup base later). Add all other ingredients from sugar to ginger powder. Stir thoroughly and continue to gently boil until desired thickness is reached. To speed up the thickening process, you can cheat by adding a bit of water-dissolved cornstarch to the mix. It can also be made in roasting pan in oven – judging the cooking time, as you like.

Salmon Pie

3 small cans salmon (optional - remove bones & skin)

4 pie shells

salt and pepper to taste

Boil potatoes until they can be mashed. Use butter or margarine only, do not add milk. Add diced carrots and salmon. Stir together well. Generously fill 2 pie shells, then cover with the other two pie shells, pinch edge and trim. Bake at 425 F for 35 minutes. Let cool and eat with ketchup (lots). Store in the refrigerator (day old is better and more firm).

When I was growing up there were two things you could count on at Christmas, (besides presents), meat pies and salmon pies. Now over the years, I have heard of meat pies but never salmon pies. I still make them every year at Christmas time. They are good anytime and are a crowd pleaser.
