SUMMERTIME SUN AND HEAT SAFETY TIPS

- When outside for the day or even a few hours, you should pay attention to the effects of too much sun and heat. Always protect your skin from damaging UV rays by wearing sunscreen with a minimum SPF 45. Read the manufacturer's directions and apply sunscreen accordingly.
- Stay out of the sun during the hottest part of the day (10:00 am till 4:00 pm).
 Sunburns and heat stresses can also occur on cloudy, overcast days.
- Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water and fruit juices. Carry a refillable water bottle.
- Protect your eyes, and your children's eyes, by wearing sunglasses that have a UV protective coating.
- Young children and the elderly are especially at risk from excessive sun and heat exposure. This does not mean that a strong, healthy person is safe. Watch out for the signs of heat stroke, heat exhaustion and/or dehydration in yourself and your families. These symptoms can include any combinations of dry mouth, excessive thirst, scant urinary output, muscle pain or spasms in the legs, shoulders or abdomen, vomiting, hot and red skin, absence of sweating, fever and rapid shallow breathing. If at all in doubt, contact a doctor or health professional or visit the emergency room IMMEDIATELY. If you are wondering if there is cause for concern, err on the side of caution at once. An affected person's condition can rapidly deteriorate in a very short time.
