Our Purpose


- To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and

IMPORTANT REMINDER

Our waiting list continues to grow rapidly. **Do not let you membership lapse, even by a day.** If your membership does lapse and you wish to rejoin the club as a member, your name will be added to the waiting list until an opening is available. DANGER - THIN ICE

We know that it is hard to imagine ice fishing with the temperatures so warm for November, but it will get colder and the pond will freeze.

Just a friendly reminder that:

- A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of clear ice is necessary to support the weight of a person
- The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly
- Stay off any unsafe ice
- Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone on the ice
- Obey the signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice.
- Mark your fishing holes for safety
- When in doubt, stay off the ice

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months, on short notice and sometimes time does not always allow for the members to be notified by newsletter.

- Never leave candles unattended or on surfaces that could catch fire.
