Did you know that tinsel, the sparkle glue and regular glue on many decorations are highly poisonous to small animals? As tempting as it seems in the holiday season, do not feed your pet anything but their regular food.

Spend time with your pet. They are often overlooked during the holidays as we enjoy the festivities.

Never leave candles, a fireplace or woodstove unattended for any length of time. A fire can become out of control in a few moments.
