MESSAGE FROM A DIRECTOR

Several more records! In 2009 I thought we had reached our plateau for annual tree sales. Well I was wrong. I am happy to report that 2010 has topped every previous year. More volunteers dedicated more hours to the challenge. More snow arrived. More trees were sold. More wreaths and swags were sold. I am pretty sure we made more money for the club but that is a calculation for Steve, our club Treasurer.

This year 98 volunteers expended over 1400 hours to our project. 33 turned out to set up the tree lot. 51 put muscles into the unloading the transport and opening the first wave of trees to be sold.

Immediately upon arrival of the trees, Hermann Szielasko and his wreath brigade went to work making beautiful wreaths and swags from the lower branches of the trees. Throughout the year Hermann and his group have been gathering supplies from nature and home for this project. It is easy to see this fundraiser growing in years to come. What a great start. Well-done Wreath brigade. Two thumbs up.

Sales started on Nov 27th. Three weeks later on Dec 19th we had sold 951 trees, 600 bags, and 100 wreaths and swags.

The early snowstorms caused lots of havoc and called for a lot of extra bull work to keep the tree lot clear and the sales going. Our gang rallied to the challenge. They did themselves proud.

Our busiest day was Dec 11th when 169 trees were sold. The afternoon shift with 13 volunteers sold 85 trees and bagged 40 of them. A Christmas tree was leaving the lot every 3 minutes. Not quite a record for us but a pretty busy day.

It was a true pleasure to see so man of our new members volunteering this year. No doubt everyone enjoyed the experience and hopefully they will be gung ho for the next year. We have to be proud that nearly 40 percent of our primary members participate in this fundraiser of the year. Take a bow people.

Sincere thanks to everyone for your contribution to our huge success this year. Thanks especially to my wife, Marian and all the partners who would hold down the home front while "hubby" is out having fun. Without your contribution there just wouldn't be a tree sale fundraiser for the club.

DANGER - THIN ICE

With the arrival of cold temperatures in December, ice formed on the pond. In January, the temperatures stayed cold allowing our ice to get thicker. Here are just a few reminders about ice safety:

A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the middle dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration pipes. This area may stay as open water or may have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from this area, as it will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight.

A <u>minimum</u> of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of a person.

The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. We currently have thin ice areas (near aeration buoys which are marked) and some slushy areas (unmarked) so please avoid these sections of the pond.

Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone Mark your fishing holes – for safety and consideration of others.

HOCKEY DAY IN CANADA

This year marks the 11th year of Hockey Day in Canada, which was started by Scotia Bank in an effort to get people involved with our national sport. This year, the official festivities will be held in Whitehorse. If you visit the online site "Hockey Day in Canada", you will find it full of events, information and memorabilia auction.
