Wreath sales were better than last year for sure and expected to increase in the future as they get to be known. Congratulations to Hermann Szielasko and his hard working team for a job well done!

I'm very sure this year has comfortably met our expectations for profits. Details can be obtained from the Treasurer when attending a meeting.

To sum up, approximately 110 of our club members have been involved in tree sales and wreath manufacturing this year, dedicating over 1400 hours of their valuable time.

#### DANGER - THIN ICE

WOFGPA Executive advises members against venturing out on the ice this winter. With the unseasonably mild winter, an ice layer has formed on the pond. This ice is very thin and unstable and extremely unsafe.

Here are just a few reminders about ice safety:

- A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of <u>CLEAR</u>
   <u>ICE</u> is necessary to support the weight of one
   person. If you are fishing with a partner or a
   group, additional ice thickness is required.
- The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day.
- Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice
- Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone.
- Mark your fishing holes for safety and consideration of others.
- A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the front dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration stones. These two areas may stay as open water or may have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from these areas, as they will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight.
- Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice. It is the Club policy that all dogs be leashed at all times.

#### **ICE FISHING**

If the weather becomes colder and the ice is deemed as safe to venture out on, an ice derby may be scheduled but it will be on very short notice. Unfortunately, this short notice often does not allow for the members to be notified by newsletter.

If you want telephone notification of scheduled derby, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs at 519-668-2609.

The ice fishing derby dates will be posted on the website and the Bulletin Boards at the club.
