- All membership fees must be up to date on election night. Please have your valid membership card with you. (The one-month grace period for membership renewal will not apply).
- One vote shall apply per membership, regardless of the membership type.
- An updated membership list will be available for viewing at the club after February 28, 2010.

The Election each year is a very important part of this organization. Our members' input and participation into the election process is necessary to keep this organization viable and accountable to its members.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

You may obtain your valid membership sticker when you pay your membership renewal at any meeting or through special arrangement with Stan Gibbs only. **DO NOT MAIL YOUR PAYMENT OR LEAVE IT WITH THE CARETAKERS.**

As a member, if you do not have a valid card displayed, you should expect to be asked by any other member to stop fishing and that you must leave the premises immediately. Any non-members caught fishing on club property are subject to prosecution for both trespassing and poaching. Observe your fishing limits, which are determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Logbook.

DANGER – THIN ICE

When the latter part of December arrived, the temperature started to fall and ice has formed on the pond. **The pond ice is currently very unsafe to venture out on**, as it is still early in the winter season. Here are just a few reminders about ice safety:

- A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the front dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration pipes. **We anticipate that this area may stay as open water or may have a very thin ice covering. Please keep well away from this area by at least 50 feet, as it will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet’s weight.**
- A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of clear ice is necessary to support the weight of a person. Additional ice thickness is needed if you are with a group
- The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly
- Stay off any unsafe ice. Stay off the ice if you are unsure of the current ice conditions.
- Always use the “Buddy” system and never venture out alone
- Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice.
- Mark your fishing holes – for safety.

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months and often on very short notice. Unfortunately, this short notice does not always allow for the members to be notified by newsletter. If you want to know about upcoming derbies, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs and check the Bulletin Boards and website regularly.
