

DANGER - THIN ICE

We know that it is hard to imagine ice fishing with the record breaking warm November temperatures we have had. With the arrival of cold temperatures in December, ice has formed on the pond. Here are just a few reminders about ice safety:

A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the front dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration pipes. This area may stay as open water or may have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from this area, as it will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight. Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice.

A <u>minimum</u> of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of a person.

The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day.

Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone

Mark your fishing holes - for safety and consideration of others

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months and often on very short notice. Unfortunately, this short notice does not always allow for the members to be notified by newsletter. If you want telephone notification of scheduled derbies, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs. The derby dates will be posted on the website and the Bulletin Boards at the club.
