The tree and wreath project involved approximately 115 volunteers who spent over 1600 hours to make the wreaths and smoothly operate the sales lot. Wreath production is very labour intensive. Congratulations to Hermann and his entire Wreath Group for an super job done.

Again this year we have shown what a great organization we have when better than half of our membership volunteer their time in this annual project. Thirty of our volunteers put in over 20 hours to this project and several actually contribute over 40 hours. Without these volunteers you can be sure our tree sales fund raiser would no doubt challenge us to keep our membership fees so low.

Special thanks to Brian Ernteman for his mustering the loyal troops again this year while I was away and all others that make the job so easy in so many ways.

FAMILY DAY ICE FISHING DERBY Mon. Feb. 16, 2015

The Executive is pleased to announce that one of our enterprising members, Pat Devincenzo, who also owns Angling Sports in London, will host an ice fishing derby for the whole family to enjoy.

This derby will take place on our pond on Family Day, which is Monday, February 16th, 2015 from 9am till 1pm. There will be prizes for big fish in specific different species, and a good hot lunch to fill you up.

The cost for this event is \$10.00 per angler. Due to limited parking and hall capacity, this event will be held to the first 100 people who have pre-registered and paid at Angling Sports, located on Highbury Ave. just south of Dundas St.

As commonly practiced for all our derbies, no fishing is allowed prior to derby time and only the registered participants can fish the pond during the derby.

RULE CLARIFICATION

Recently, I was asked to clarify when the ice fishing season starts, which would then allow a member to use 2 angling rods.

This issue was discussed at the December Executive meeting. At that time, I advised the members present that the staff at Aylmer's MNR office explained "safe and legal" ice fishing depends on the weather conditions of the day. To start, anyone walking on ice should be aware that at least 4 inches of clear ice is needed to safely support one person. Then, once safely on the frozen pond, you must cut, chop or drill a hole in the ice to "ice fish" with two rods. The MNR office also explained that any open water accessible to an angler means that only one rod is allowed.

I hope this clarifies the rules, as interpreted by MNR, when ice fishing on the property.

DANGER - THIN ICE

December weather means a drop in the daily temperature and we know that ice has started to form on the pond. Currently, the ice will not support any weight and there is still plenty of open water, so please stay on the docks to fish.

Here are just a few reminders about pond ice safety:

A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the middle dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration stones. These two areas may stay as open water or may have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from these areas, as they will never be deemed safe to support any person's weight, including your pet's weight.

Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice. It is the club policy that all dogs be leashed at all times and under the direct control of their owners.

A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of one person. If you are fishing with a partner or a group, additional ice thickness is required.

The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice.

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone.

Mark your fishing holes with a flag or small branch – for safety and consideration of others.

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months and often on very short notice. Unfortunately, this short notice often does not allow for the members to be notified by newsletter. If you want telephone notification of scheduled derbies, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs at 519-668-2609. The ice derby dates will be posted on the website and the Bulletin Boards at the club.
