#### Summertime safety

A day at the park, the cottage or the beach can be very enjoyable in the summertime. We should, however pay attention to the effects of too much sun and heat.

Young children and the elderly are especially at risk. This does not mean that a strong, healthy person is safe from too much sun or heat exposure.

Watch out for the signs of heat stroke, heat exhaustion and/or dehydration in yourself and your families. These symptoms can include any combinations of dry mouth, excessive thirst, scant urinary output, muscle pain or spasms in the legs, shoulders or abdomen, vomiting, hot and red skin, absence of sweating, fever and rapid shallow breathing.

If at all in doubt, contact a doctor or health care professional or visit the emergency room **IMMEDIATELY**. If you are wondering if there is cause for concern, err on the side of caution at once. An affected person's condition can rapidly deteriorate in a very short time.

Always protect your skin from damaging UV rays by wearing sunscreen with a minimum spf 45. Reapply sunscreen according to the directions on the container.

Stay out of the sun during the hottest part of the day (11:00 am till 3:00 pm).

Protect your eyes by wearing sunglasses that have a UV protective coating.
