### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

At the June 9<sup>th</sup> General Meeting, a guest speaker, Randy Bailey will be updating club members about the Springbank Dam updates. Immediately following his presentation, we will hold our BBQ Meat Draw.

Now that the warm weather is here with a vengeance, there are even more opportunities to drop a line in the water at the club. With so many unused fishing rods being put into action after a long cold winter, the possibilities of crowding our docks is inevitable.

At this time, I would like to remind everyone that proper fishing etiquette be observed. Take care not to crowd another angler. Do not cast your line across theirs or crowd them into a small area of the dock. The anglers in boats should not venture too close to the docks where other anglers are. Bass are out of season and will soon start spawning. Please do not target these fish. If you do catch one by accident, please return it to the water as soon as possible in a non-stressful manner. Also, take a few moments to review the limits associated with your membership type.

I would also like to remind all those using the fish cleaning station to properly clean both top and bottom shelf when done. Discard any fish parts into the bush where they will be quickly eaten by raccoons. If each angler took a few moments to sweep the goose poop off the dock, there would be no reason to complain about a buildup. The geese are here to stay and we have to learn to work with them.

Under no conditions, should children be on the docks unsupervised. Please drive slowly on the property and driveway. This will reduce kicking up gravel that will cause potholes and can scratch cars. Watch for pedestrians at all times.

Our two areas for parking are the main lot and in the back by the boat racks, both of which are large enough to accommodate all vehicles. Parking is **not permitted** in the main driveway just north and west of the building. This area seems to have become popular lately due to the shade trees. Please be considerate to others by not parking in this narrow main driveway and limiting their access.

It has also come to the Executive's attention that some anglers have altered their hooks so that they can catch Trout, bring them in close and then allow the fish to get off the hook before it is landed. This practice tires the Trout and can stress them to the point of death. It is a form of catch and release, which will not be tolerated. If you are currently doing this, stop immediately. If you wish to feel the "fight" of the fish without landing it, please choose another body of water for this purpose.
