#### **HOW TO CATCH AND RELEASE**

If you leave a hook in a fish, will it eventually rust away as many anglers believe? Many anglers believe that if they just cut the line, the hook will eventually rust out of the fish. This belief is widespread because many anglers think there is no harm to the fish. This is false.

Many fish have been found with rotted stomachs that are full of holes from the tips of the hooks because the angler just cut the line and left the hook deeply embedded in the fish.

Here are some numbers that will make you think twice about leaving that hook in. John Foster, recreational fisheries coordinator for the Maryland District MNR held bass in holding tanks containing 50 percent seawater to measure how long it takes hooks to dissolve. He used seawater to speed up the dissolution process. What he discovered is amazing.

After four months, not a single stainless steel hook had dissolved. Bronze hooks did the best but 70 percent were still in the fish. Eighty percent of the tincadmium hooks were still there. Eighty three percent of the nickel hooks were still in the fish.

Here are a few simple steps to help remove that deeply embedded hook successfully:

- Open the fish's mouth and note which gill flap the hook shank is closest to.
- Gently open that gill flap and, using your thumb and index finger, reach in through the space between the last gill filament and the fish's side. Carefully pull the hook eye through the opening and rotate the hook so the bend becomes exposed and begins to back out of the fish's throat.
- Continue rolling the hook and, amazingly, you will feel the point and barb slip free inside the fish's stomach and begin to slide out of the fish's throat.
- Depending on the size of the fish and its mouth opening, use your finger, a pair of pliers or forceps to grab the bend of the hook once it has fully exposed.
- 5. Lift the hook free.

This technique takes some practice but once mastered, an angler will truly be doing catch and release.

Pictures showing this technique with step by step instructions will soon be available in the club (mail slots by the washrooms). Feel free to take one and keep it in your tackle box. Once you master the technique, teach other anglers so that all fish will be released successfully.
