DANGER - UNCERTAIN ICE CONDITIONS

It is very important that you use extreme caution on the pond ice for the remainder of the winter. The days are getting longer and the temperature is rising indicating that spring isn't too far away. With that, comes the melting of snow and ice on the pond.

A <u>minimum</u> of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of a person. A windmill, located on the west side of the pond by the middle dock has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration pipes. This area may stay as open water or may have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from this area, as it will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight.

The ice conditions will be posted and monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. We currently have thin ice areas (near aeration buoys which are marked) and some slushy areas (unmarked) so please avoid these sections of the pond.

Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone

Mark your fishing holes – for safety and consideration of others.
