Over the past two years our Association has had to spend a great deal of money to ensure that our Club House remains in as good working order that can be achieved.

In the near future we will be looking at different ways to save some money and to raise a little more.

We, as an Executive have already implemented some new ways to save a little money, just on pay-outs at our derbies and euchre nights. We will also be looking at admission fees for events, hall rentals, and aggressive fund raising ventures.

Also included but not sanctioned by this derby will be frequent runs to Tim Horton's (Ladies, you will have to convince your assistants to do this one for you). Each lady is allowed to use only one rod at a time.

At noon all trout will be measured. Trout will then be cleaned and cooked by the men folk and served as a side at lunch, which will be served shortly thereafter.

After lunch, prizes will be awarded to the three top ladies with the longest fish count. There will also be prizes for girls aged twelve and under.
