Our Purpose


- •To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, Propagation and conservation of fish and game.

5TH ANNUAL LADIES' ONLY DERBY

DATE: Sat., May 10 TIME: Register at 7:30 Derby time: 8:00am until noon, lunch & awards to follow

COST: Members \$ 12.00

Non-Members \$15.00

Youth \$ 5.00 (12 and under)

Assistant's meal \$5.00

HOST: Andre Koch

The format will be as follows:

No member fishing is allowed on Ladies' Only Derby day until derby starts. During derby time, only ladies may angle Trout using one rod at a time. An assistant, who being a member of the menfolk, may accompany the lady. The assistant cannot directly cast or handle the lady's rod to land the fish; either of these actions will disqualify the lady's catch as it is not caught by the lady. The assistant's help is restricted to carrying equipment, baiting hooks, netting fish, operating the boat (if you have one), in-boat entertainment and securing refreshments and lunch. Also included, if the lady so desires, but which cannot be sanctioned by this derby, will be the assistant's frequent Timmy runs. Culling and use of corn is prohibited. At noon all Trout will be measured. Trout will then be cleaned and cooked by the assistants and served as a side dish at lunch. After the meal, prizes will be awarded to the three (3) top ladies with the longest Trout length in both adult and youth divisions. All members will be allowed to fish after 12:00 pm and daily catch limits will apply after that time.

PFD's AND SAFETY

Other anglers assisted by getting the tipped canoe and gear back to the boat rack and locked up. Kudos to all who came to the rescue.

It is the law that each person in a watercraft wear a properly sized PFD. You may be a great boater and swimmer and feel that you would never end up in the water, but consider if you were suddenly tipped into the freezing cold water and you had a head injury or were disoriented slightly.

For a club that stresses safety to its members – please **wear** your pdfs. It could save your life. So, be safe out there.

SOME FRIENDLY REMINDERS

MEMBERSHIP

You must display a valid membership badge while fishing at the club. Please observe your daily limits as determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Book.

Each membership, except Youth, is allowed 2 guests per year and any Trout caught by a guest will count toward the member's daily catch limit

Payments mailed to the club will not be accepted. If you are unable to attend a meeting to pay your dues, please make special arrangements with Val Grahl (Membership)

SMOKING

If you are someone who smokes and are visiting the club, please use the conveniently placed receptacles provided for your cigarette butts. Please do not toss them in the grass or on the parking lot. We are sure that you would find this very unsightly on your property and ask that you treat the club property with that same level of respect. Smoking is not permitted within 5 metres of any club entrance.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING

Garbage cans are located throughout the property for your use. Recycling cans are located on the club patio.

PETS AND CHILDREN

All dogs must be on leash on club property and under the control of their owner at all times. A barking dog is not appreciated by other anglers.

If you bring children to the club and they grow tired of fishing, as they often do, we ask that you do not allow them to run up and down the docks while you continue to fish. All children under 16 must be supervised at all times on the property which includes the docks.

The docks are for anglers to gain access to the water. They are not a piece of playground equipment.

GEESE, DUCKS and WILDLIFE

Club members are reminded never to feed the Canada Geese or ducks, any food, especially breads. The Deer and Coyotes and Turkeys are all wildlife that fend for themselves and do not require human assistance to survive. Your intentions may be well meaning, but they are wild animals and their natural food supply is readily available.

For your convenience, the Suggestion Box will be relocated into the hall by the washrooms from its current location in the Fish Registry Room. A lock will be put on it. The Executive and Committees hope that you will use this Suggestion Box to provide some fresh ideas, comments and constructive criticisms. Club members who do not display their valid membership card should expect to be told by the caretakers or any member to immediately stop fishing.

Non-members caught fishing on club property could be charged with trespassing and poaching.
