PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Club Etiquette

Recently, it has been brought to my attention that some anglers have started the practice of crimping the barbs on their hooks and playing with the trout they catch until eventually they shake off the hook. I also use this practice to minimize the damage to the fish if they happen to get off. This practice is respected in the wild but not such a good idea in our pond. In the wild, the fish are much more adapt to survive, given the lack of predators and a less confined area to move. In our pond, there are large turtles, blue herons and a resident osprey that would not hesitate to consume a tired trout. When I hear that someone has hooked up to fifteen trout in one day but has not landed one leads me to believe that this person is abusing our fishery. We should all remember that we have a fish and take policy in our club and every effort should be made to land a hooked trout.

Another area of concern is the presence of members on our property well after dark. When we all took our orientation the rule "fishing hours are from dawn till dusk every day" is quite clear. We have added one half hour before and after sunset unless you are attending a function. If people are seen on our property during restricted times the police will be called to address trespassing issues.

On a lighter note I would like to thank Autumn Ernteman for her outstanding effort in selling tickets on our custom made cooler that was given away at the Spring Trout Derby. Through her efforts we made a profit which was looking doubtful for a while. She also initiated a very good response to our petition on the 'Decommission of the Springbank Dam'. Great work Autumn!

At the May General Meeting, around 8:30 pm, our ward councilor, Jared Zaifman, will be coming to speak to members about the Springbank Dam project. There has been a lot of discussion and controversy about whether the dam should be repaired or decommissioned. Please come out and get informed about the issues.

The format will be as follows:
