Our Purpose


- •To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and game.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The next time you get out to the Club, you will notice a couple of white buoys on the water. These are attached to aeration heads that will oxygenate the water from air supplied by the windmill that is mounted on the ponds edge, on top of a telephone pole.

This system should help keep the water oxygen levels at a much higher concentration, therefore keeping our fish healthier.

Since this equipment is very expensive, and difficult to repair, I ask that you refrain from fishing around these markers. If for some reason your line gets caught on one of the guide ropes or worse yet, one of the lines that are running along the bottom of the pond to these markers, please do not use any force trying to retrieve your tackle, just cut your line.

In the coming months when the pond freezes over, the aeration system should keep the water open around the markers. Since this is a wind driven device, the water may freeze over temporarily, but beware, the ice around the markers will be unsafe for people to be on.

As a member, if you do not have a valid card displayed, you should expect to be asked by any other member to stop fishing and that you must leave the premises immediately. Any non-members caught fishing on club property are subject to prosecution for both trespassing and poaching. Observe your fishing limits, which are determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Logbook.
