I'm relieved that all ended well, I can't stress enough the safety that needs to be taken while in a water craft. Members must follow all boating rules and remember that anyone operating a water craft with a motor is required to have their boating license.

SOME FRIENDLY REMINDERS

MEMBERSHIP

You must display a valid membership badge while fishing at the club. Please observe your daily limits as determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Book.

Each membership, except Youth, is allowed 2 guests per year and any Trout caught by a guest will count toward the member's daily catch limit

There are no General meetings held in July and August. Membership dues will be accepted at 7:00 pm of the night of the Executive meetings in the summer months.

SMOKING
