

temperature cools to at least 58°F. Stocking can then occur without stressing and killing the Trout.

Stocking often happens without much notice (and often doesn't make it into the monthly newsletter) due to the water temperature and delivery availability. Watch the bulletin boards at the club for details as the weather cools.

Please remember to record your catch in the Fish Log Book located just inside the side entrance. The Fishing rules are posted as a reminder of the catch limits allotted to each membership type. Culling is not allowed.

On Sat., October 2, London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care, London held a dedication ceremony and tree planting for the transfer of the balance of the Westminster Ponds lands to the City of London. A large rock from the property contains the dedication plaque shown above. It has taken over 30 years for these groups, government, concerned citizens and groups like the McIllwraith Field Naturalists and Upper Thames River Conservation Authority to come to a final agreement as to how the land will be managed and developed. The Saunder's Pond (103 acre section) will be preserved as a natural wetland.
