



Stan Gibbs's motion, as adopted at the June 11, 2009 General Meeting and seconded by Steve Couture is reprinted and presented as follows:

Whereas the WOFGPA has as its guiding principle, "... to serve and faithfully defend from waste the natural resources of my country, its soils, minerals, waters, forests, air and wildlife ...", and this principle is conservation-based and is also the guiding principle of the OFAH; and,

Whereas the WOFGPA has identified a need to improve the conservation efforts and education of the Club members in regard to Club's guiding principle; and,

Whereas the WOFGPA traditionally has been affiliated, in part or in whole, with the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters since the inception of the OFAH; and,

Whereas the OFAH is an organization that promotes conservation, on behalf of its many member clubs, and also provides many opportunities for its members to participate in educational and "hands-on" conservation initiatives that benefit all Ontarians;

Be it resolved that all types of WOFGPA membership (Single, Family, Senior and Life) shall be required to become members of the OFAH, either upon joining the Club as a new member, or upon renewal of an existing 2009 membership, and that a vote shall be taken, by secret ballot on October 8, 2009, at the General Meeting. (A majority vote of all present at the Meeting will rule.)

And further, that any increase in the WOFGPA current membership fee that is necessary to cover the cost of said OFAH membership shall be decided by vote of members present at the 2010 Annual General Meeting (March 11, 2010), in accordance with Article 11.4.1 of the WOFGPA Constitution.

And further that said vote at the 2010 Annual General Meeting be a vote by secret ballot prior to the Election of the Executive and Directors for the 2010 year.

Observe your fishing limits, which are determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Logbook.

FALL TROUT DERBY

The rules are really quite simple.

- The longest total length of 3 Trout caught will determine the winners of 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division. Of course, there will also be the Mystery Fish.
- Your paid registration includes a hot lunch with refreshments. Your name will also be entered to win one of the many door prizes.
- During the derby, only registered anglers in the derby will be allowed to fish. Trout caught during the derby will count only for the derby.
- Once the derby has ended, everyone is invited to fish and all regular catch limits for your membership type will apply.

We expect to stock Trout in the pond the exact date will be dependent on the water temperature. As in previous years, the water MUST cool to less than 60°F (15.5°C) in order to have a successful stocking of Trout. The water temperature will drop when we start getting the cool fall nights and will be monitored regularly. We usually do not have sufficient time to notify the members by newsletter as to which date has been chosen to stock the pond. For this reason, we ask that you check the Bulletin Boards at the club beginning in early October for details about the next Trout stocking.

All the Christmas trees will be delivered in one load during the daytime hours. Many strong, young men are needed to help assist with unloading these trees and to stand them up in place. Many hands will help to make short work of it for everyone.

Tree Sales start and will continue until all trees are sold. This year there will an additional 25 snow tipped Fraser fir trees in the 8-10 foot range, which will sold at a higher cost.

This is our largest fundraiser of the year. It is what keeps your membership dues so low compared to other organizations of similar nature and funds many of the events throughout the year. It ensures a continuous stock of fish in the pond.

Starting in late October and early November, Don Colborne will begin collecting the names of volunteers for the tree lot set up, the tree delivery and for tree sales.

When each person became a member, they agreed as part of their membership, that they would give of themselves to the betterment of the club. If you have never come out to assist with a function, now is a good time to get to put a name to a new face as you meet the other members in a relaxed atmosphere.
