Our Purpose


- •To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and game.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

You may obtain your valid membership card when you pay your membership renewal at any meeting or through special arrangement with Stan Gibbs only. **DO NOT MAIL YOUR PAYMENT**.

As a member, if you do not have a valid card displayed, you should expect to be asked by any other member to stop fishing and that you must leave the premises immediately. Any non-members caught fishing on club property are subject to prosecution for both trespassing and poaching.

Observe your fishing limits, which are determined by your membership type and record your catch in the Fish Registry Logbook.

Remember that at each General Meeting you attend, you will get a ballot per membership for the free one-year membership draw. The draw is held annually on Election night as one of the first duties of the new President. Come to a General meeting and get your name on a ballot.

PLEASURE CRAFT OPERATORS CARD

As of September 15, 2009, all operators of motorized pleasure craft must possess a Pleasure Craft Operator's Card when operating a boat, canoe, and Jet Ski or pleasure craft.

To obtain a Pleasure Craft Operator Card, candidates need to pass an accredited test. Visit www.tc.gc.ca and search "operator card" for more information. The Pleasure Craft Operators card is valid for life.

Here is a short list of some of the penalties / fines imposed on boat operators, not including any administrative fees:

\$ 250	not possessing a pleasure craft operator's card or
	not having it with you when stopped
\$ 100	underage operation of a pleasure craft
\$ 100	speeding on waterways
\$ 250	operation of a pleasure craft in a careless manner
\$ 600	minimum fine for operation while under the
	influence of alcohol (no level of blood alcohol is
	acceptable as it is for driving a car). You will also
	be forbidden from operating a pleasure craft for
	three years.

\$ 200 for each absent or incorrectly sized pdf on the pleasure craft

Although the government has given a few years notice that a Pleasure Craft Operators card will be required as of September 15, 2009, many individuals have procrastinated at getting their card. You can expect that all waterways will be monitored closely and all watercraft operators can expect to be asked to show proof of a valid Pleasure Craft Operators card.

Please act responsibly and get yours now.

FALL TROUT DERBY

Date: Sunday, October 18, 2009
Registration: 7:30 am (NO EARLIER)
Derby Times: 8:00 am until Noon
Cost: Members - \$ 12.00
Non-Members - \$ 15.00
Youth (12 & under) - \$ 5.00

The rules are really quite simple.

- The longest total length of 3 Trout caught will determine the winners of 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division. Of course, there will also be the Mystery Fish.
- Your paid registration includes a hot lunch with refreshments. Your name will also be entered to win one of the many door prizes.
- During the derby, only registered anglers in the derby will be allowed to fish. Trout caught during the derby will count only for the derby.
- Once the derby has ended, everyone is invited to fish and all regular catch limits for your membership type will apply.

We expect to stock Trout in the pond but of course this will be dependant on the water temperature. As in previous years, the water MUST cool to less than 60°F (15.5°C) in order to have a successful stocking of Trout. The water temperature will drop when we start getting the cool fall nights and will be monitored regularly. We usually do not have sufficient time to notify the members by newsletter as to which date has been chosen to stock the pond. For this reason, we ask that you check the Bulletin Boards at the club beginning in early October for details about the next Trout stocking.
