Our Purpose


- •To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and game.

As of Sept. 2009, each boat that is <u>under power</u> in Ontario must be operated by someone with a valid card, which <u>must</u> be present on the operator of the watercraft.

This law will be enforced on the pond at WOFGPA.

If you are already in possession of a valid card, please let Jim Morrow know by telephone at 519-649-2405 so he can note this on your Boat Rack Agreement.

We currently have 6 spots available on the Boat Rack.

Please take all items such as oars, seats and anchors home with you if you cannot secure them to your satisfaction. Also, please drain your boat of standing water on a regular basis if it cannot be stored upside down, which is preferable. Thank you for storing your boat or canoe properly.

Recently, a few chairs have been left on or near the docks and ended up in the water. If you bring your own chair, please take it home each day. Benches are provided on the docks for all anglers.
