Our Purpose


- To promote true sportsmanship by the protection, breeding, propagation, and conservation of fish and game.

President's Message

A member suggested that personal fishing, hunting, camping, or any unique outdoor trip might be worth sharing with the rest of the membership. Well, here is mine.

My long time fishing partner and good friend, Richard does this trip every year about the second week of July. Why July you ask? Because Bass season doesn't open till the end of June and for those of you who know me, you know I love to fish for those big old bucket mouths. Weeks before our trip we start shopping for all the latest line, rods, reels, and tackle that will attract and land that big five pound plus Lunker, that every bass angler dreams of getting. Hours are spent on learning new techniques and stories being told about past trips where sometimes we got them and sometimes they got away.

Well, the day finally comes and we are joined at this favorite fishing spot of many anglers, to a beautiful warm but slightly overcast day. The water is calm and warm; the weeds are thick and green, just perfect for bassin. We start fishing the weed-infested shoreline and I have immediate success with a wacky rig setup for rubber worms. The bass are plentiful but nothing too big to brag about. Richard sticks with his Texas worm rig and nets a nice bass, again nothing to brag about. As the morning wears on, the sun comes out, and a breeze picks up. This usually sends the bass down deeper, so we started using crank baits, without much success. So we went back to our favorite rigs, Wacky and Texas and did a slower presentation, this netted many bass, but again nothing too big.

We knew there were big bass in this lake; we just had to find them. Near lunchtime, and only minutes before we had decided to call it a day, we tried a favorite spot of mine, where we had both caught big bass before, I dropped my Wacky rig and let it float to the bottom around a tree that was partially submerged. After it touched bottom, I twitched it a couple of times, and was rewarded with a hefty pull on my line. At first I thought it was a smaller bass, because it was coming up for his tail kicking show, but after he broke the surface, my heart skipped a beat. This was a BIG OLE LUNCKER! After all was said and done, with the help of my good friend Richard, the 4.5 lb, 20 inch long bass was netted, measured and photo taken, then released in good health to fight another day.

That is my story, and I suppose you are wondering where this honey hole is, and how to get there. That's easy; just go to 790 Southdale Rd in London, ON. It's the best bass fishin' hole I know.
