Timely and accurate information will assist conservation officers in apprehending violators and *protect your natural resources*. The OFAH encourages you to report anything suspicious to the MNR Tips line. The information you have may just be the important piece needed to *stop the abuse*. Our MNR Conservation Officers cannot be everywhere all of the time.

# Attention hunters, anglers outdoor enthusiasts!

#### Comments on hunting in Norfolk County By Jim Greenwood

When I speak to hunter education students, I remind them how blessed we are to live in Norfolk County. Much of the landscape is forested, and with cold water streams and a large farming base, we have the habitat to support an abundance and diversity of wildlife.

Hunting is a life style choice, accepted and practiced by many. It's not just about the harvest, although wild game is a healthy alternative to products we purchase, but more importantly it brings people closer to nature.

A few years ago while out for a spring wild turkey hunt I positioned myself along the edge of a field a few feet above an old railway line.

Looking to my right I saw a fox running across the field and then head down the railway line towards me. I could see it had a rabbit in its mouth as it approached closer. Dressed in camoflauge, I sat still and watched as the fox stopped below me. It dropped the dead rabbit, and using its front paws dug a hole, dropped the rabbit in it and then carefully covered the hole with leaves and sticks.

When it had completed its task, and to my amazement, the fox scampered up to where I was sitting and sat down beside me. It was close enough I could have put my arm around it. I think it knew that I was there, but didn't seem to be concerned. After a few short minutes it rambled off.

I thought after that if I hadn't been hunting I would never had witnessed this. I didn't harvest a turkey that morning. What I did get was to witness something very special that will be part of my hunting memories that I can share with others.

Long Point Waterfowl initiated its scaup research program in 1999 in response to declining continental scaup populations and the fact that little was known about the staging or wintering ecology of Lesser or Greater Scaup using the lower Great Lakes region. The continental scaup population began declining in the mid-1980s and one of the hypotheses for the decline was that birds were acquiring elevated contaminant burdens on staging and/or wintering areas. Early studies by LPW documented that scaup using the lower Great Lakes consistently ate zebra mussels and acquired elevated levels of selenium. LPW implanted 45 Lesser and Greater Scaup to study movement patters and to determine how much time females had to depurate selenium prior to egg-laying. Calculations based on these movements (and our field and captive studies) indicate that selenium likely is not a major factor affecting scaup survival or reproduction. Long Point Waterfowl's scaup satellite telemetry project remains active and will provide novel information about migration pathways and habitat use of birds that use the lower Great Lakes during migration. We cannot do it all alone and having you as an individual or your club as part of the team is an important factor in our success moving forward.

The toolkit for hosting your own youth mentored hunt is now being rolled out provincially with a host of partners being part of the official launch. It is a fact we as members of the outdoors community need to recognize that whatever other organizations you belong to be it Delta, Ducks Unlimited, NWTF, QDMA, regardless, we need to be a team if we are going to accomplish a positive impact on developing the next generation of outdoors persons. As leading conservation organizations we should not be competing between ourselves but competing together to recruit these people away from other non- hunting/fishing/conservation activities. 
