CHRISTMAS TREE AND WREATH SALES 2017

We still have the touch!

Our rounded / ball park figures for tree sales this year leave no doubt our volunteers are in peak performance again this year.

My records show about 1400 hours were spent by 133 volunteers to set up, unload, sell and dismantle the lot over a period of three weeks. Actual tree sales lasted only 19 days to put 1000 trees out the driveway. Last tree sold on Dec 13th - the same date as last year. Appears our customers know they have to shop early or look elsewhere for their tree.

I'm told Hermann's group added another 400 volunteer hours to the effort by making near 170 wreaths, swags and minis of various types – A great record to be proud of. Congratulations to your group Hermann. WELL DONE!

But for some pretty bad weather near the end of the sale, everything went pretty well without a hitch. We ran into the usual minor problems with scheduling this year where some shifts were overbooked while others were a bit short but in the end, we "got-er-done".

Point of interest – our top volunteer this year put in 60 hours at the club. Now that's another record! Many donated 20 to 30 hours and more and everyone needs a pat on the back for a job well done.

My personal thanks to Brian Ernteman again this year for all his help with phone calls, scheduling and records, and to everyone who helped in any way to make this fund raiser such a success. Our combined thanks to all the Executive, the unsung people, who put in so many unrecorded hours of support and effort in the background.

Lastly a special thanks to all the partners who support our volunteers from the home front and for all the treats to the trailer: cookies, doughnuts, candies, oranges and chocolates just to name a few.

Just a couple of small points for those that might have an interest. This year we purchased 200 trees that should have sold for \$ 50 each. In fact, we actually only sold 176 of those trees for \$ 50 each. The remaining 800 trees were purchased as a planned mix between the \$30 and \$40 trees. We actually sold 421 trees for \$30 and 402 trees for \$40. Pretty much the even split we expected. NOT BAD Eh!

DANGER - THIN ICE

December weather usually means a drop in the daily temperature and we know that soon, the ice will form on the pond despite the warm weather we have had through November. Please stay on the docks to fish until the ice has completely formed and is at least 10 cm. thick.

A windmill has been installed to aerate the water. There are buoys marking the location of the aeration stones. These two areas may stay as open water or will have a thin ice covering. Please keep well away from these areas, as they will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight.

Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice. It is the club policy that all dogs be leashed at all times and in control of their owners.

A <u>minimum</u> of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of one person. If you are fishing with a partner or a group, additional ice thickness is required.

The ice conditions will be monitored regularly although the conditions are not posted. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. Obey the thin ice signs and exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice.

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone.

Mark your fishing holes with a flag or small branch – for safety and consideration of others.

Ice derbies will be held throughout the winter months and often on very short notice. If you want telephone notification of scheduled derbies, please leave your name and number with Stan Gibbs. The derby dates will be posted on the website and the Bulletin Boards at the club.

If you see anyone fishing with no visible membership card, ask to see proof of valid membership. Club members who do not display their valid membership card should expect to be told by the caretaker or any member to immediately stop fishing.

Non-members caught fishing on club property could be charged with trespassing and poaching.


