#### CHRISTMAS TREE AND WREATH SALES SUMMARY

Another very successful year for our club.

It all started way back in September with ordering a transport load of trees and the bags to wrap them.

On Nov  $17^{\text{th}}$ , the tree lot setup, combined with our fall cleanup of the club grounds was attended by 27 volunteers.

Nov 21st the transport arrived on schedule and was emptied in just about one hour by over 60 volunteers. An additional bonus this year was a dozen students from Sir Wilfred Laurier Secondary School and their teacher came to assist with the unload, set up and unwrapping many trees. Great gesture by the students and well appreciated by club members.

Three weeks later the last of our trees left the lot on Saturday Dec 15th.

Over 1000 trees and about 140 wreaths were sold this year. One hundred fifty volunteers spent about 1600 hours for preparation, wreath construction and sales. Quite an accomplishment when you consider more than 50% of our club members see fit to help in one way or another for this important annual fund raiser. If you are one of them give yourself a well-deserved pat on the back.

The wreaths were exceptionally beautiful this year and sold like hot cakes. Just a reminder for everyone to keep the club in mind when out and about (yard sales etc.) as donations of ornaments, trinkets and ribbon are needed and always welcomed for next year. Many years ago, the surplus branches were discarded until Hermann Szielasko came up with the idea of making natural wreaths. This group now generates about \$1,500 in sales.

Special thanks once again to Brian Ernteman for the great help in the phone work and scheduling this year.

Thanks to all members of the Executive who keenly support this project and keep it running smooth, always available to jump in whenever and wherever needed.

Thanks also to all the partners of volunteers who provide their support/patience and are so nice on the phone when Brian or I call looking for help. It truly makes our job more pleasant. (Not forgetting to mention all the goodies that you send to the trailer and disappear so fast)

#### ICE CONDITIONS DANGER – THIN ICE

At the current time, the pond is just starting to ice over. Many days and nights of cold weather are needed for ice to form and to be safe to venture out on. There is a lot of room on the docks and anglers are still pulling out trout.

Please stay on the docks to fish until the ice has completely formed and is at least 10 cm. (about 4 inches) thick.

When the pond freezes, an ice rink will be made just off the main dock. All anglers are asked to stay at least 20 metres away from this ice rink.

A windmill has been installed to aerate the water. If ice forms, it will be thin. Please keep clear of the windmill platform as the area around it will never be deemed safe to support any weight, including your pet's weight.

Do not let your pet run loose on the property, including the ice. It is the club policy that all dogs must be on leash and under direct control of their owners or preferably, left at home.

A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of one person. If you are fishing with a partner or a group, additional ice thickness is required.

The ice conditions are not posted but are monitored regularly. Please stay off any unsafe ice and remember that ice conditions vary from day to day. Exercise caution at all times on pond ice. When in doubt, stay off the ice.

Always use the "Buddy" system and never venture out alone.

Mark your fishing holes with a flag or small branch – for safety and consideration of others.


