Happy 150th Anniversary Canada!

Did you know that on July 1, 1867, the nation was officially born when the Constitution Act joined three provinces into one country: Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Canada province, which then split into Ontario and Quebec? However, Canada was not completely independent of England until 1982.

The holiday called Dominion Day was officially established in 1879, but it wasn't observed by many Canadians, who considered themselves to be British citizens.

Dominion Day started to catch on when the 50th anniversary of the confederation rolled around in 1917.

The 100th anniversary in 1967 saw the growth of the spirit of Canadian patriotism and Dominion Day celebrations really began to take off. Although quite a few Canadians already called the holiday Canada Day, the new name wasn't formally adopted until October of 1982.

On Sat. July 1st, 2017, join together with others to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Canada. This day is also known as the 150th anniversary of Confederation or "Canada 150" as promoted by the Canadian government.

BLACK CRAPPIE DERBY SAT., AUGUST 12

Mark your calendars so you don't miss out.

The Unofficial Bass Derby will not be held this summer but instead, WOFGPA will be holding its first Black Crappie Derby on Sat., Aug. 12. As most anglers know, the pond has an abundance of Black Crappie just waiting for your baited line or lure to entice them to take a bite.

The derby will run from 8:00 til noon with registration beginning at 7:30 am.

The winner will be determined by to length of 5 longest Black Crappie.

As with all club derbies, members are not allowed to fish the pond prior to the start of the derby. During the derby times, only registered derby participants will be allowed to fish in the club pond. Other anglers are welcome to try their luck after the derby ends at 12 noon.

More details will follow in the August newsletter.

FISHING ETIQUETTE

Please do not crowd other anglers on the docks. Moving a few feet closer will not entice the fish to bite on your line instead of your neighbour's. Junior anglers find it quite intimidating to be crowded on the docks by an adult. Remember some anglers tend to need a larger area to cast. Fly fish in suitable areas and way from other anglers.

The north and the main dock have new benches installed for members use. If you prefer to use a lawn chair, please take it home with you when done fishing. At no time are tree stumps to be used on the docks.

Each angler may use only one rod at a time. Culling your catch and the use of live bait is not permitted.

The turtles in the pond are quite large and somewhat aggressive. They have been known to take bites out of fish that are on a stringer. Be on the constant lookout for turtles while angling.

If you are fishing on the north dock, be aware that members with boats and canoes have the right-of-way. Please stop fishing or fish elsewhere while they are taking their boat in or out of the water.

All Trout can be cleaned at the steel cleaning table by the north dock. We ask that any fish wastes be tossed into the bushes where it will be considered as the "daily delicacy" by resident raccoons. Please rinse the table thoroughly with water when you are done cleaning your catch. The water at the cleaning station is pond water and should not be used for drinking. When done cleaning your catch, use hand sanitizer or wash your hands thoroughly in the washroom.

If you are taking Black Crappie home for a meal, we ask that you take enough for only one meal. The pond currently has an abundance of Black Crappie and a derby has been scheduled for Sat., Aug. 12.

Observe your daily catch limits as determined by your membership type. Record your catch in the Log book located in the small vestibule on the east side patio area. This book will also give you an idea of what bait that trout currently find attractive in an effort to increase your chances of getting a big one to take home.

All trout caught must be kept, without exception. If you choose not to keep the trout, it may be given to another angler who is present at the club. You are still required to record your catch in the Log Book as part of your daily catch limit.

SUMMERTIME SAFETY TIPS

The Executive hopes that everyone is enjoying a safe and happy, funfilled summer in spite of all the rain that we have received so far. Here are just a few tips to assist you.

It is mandatory that all persons in a watercraft on the club pond wear an appropriate sized PFD, without exception.

Your barking dog is not welcomed by other anglers, or the fish. All pets must be on leash and under their owner's control at all times. The city has off-leash parks if you choose to allow your pet to roam. The police will be notified if your pet is left in your vehicle. If you decide to fish while you are here, leave your pet at home.

While on club property, all children under age 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Under no circumstances should any child be on the dock without the direct supervision of an adult.

When outside for the day or even a few hours, you should pay attention to the effects of too much sun and heat. Always protect your skin from damaging UV rays by wearing appropriate sunscreen, according to the label directions and stay out of the sun during the hottest part of the day (10:00 am till 4:00 pm). Wear a hat and protect your eyes from damaging UV. Sunburns and heat exposure issues can even occur on an overcast day. Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water or fruit juices or eat fresh fruit. Young children and the elderly are especially at risk from excessive sun and heat exposure. A strong, healthy person is not immune to long sun exposure either.

Watch out for the signs of heat stroke, heat exhaustion and/or dehydration in yourself and your families. If at all in doubt, contact a doctor or health care professional or visit the emergency room immediately. If you are wondering if there is cause for concern, it is best to err on the side of caution without delay. An affected person's condition can rapidly deteriorate in a very short time.
