DANGER – THIN ICE

Due to unseasonably warm temperatures, the ice is not safe to venture out on. The Family Day Ice Fishing Derby was cancelled for this reason.

Please stay on the docks to fish until the ice is at least 10 cm. thick. Use caution when walking on the docks.

A minimum of four inches (10 cm.) of CLEAR ICE is necessary to support the weight of one person. If you are fishing with a partner or a group, additional ice thickness is required.


