GOOD OF THE ASSOCIATION

For each General Meeting that you attend, you will receive a ballot for the free one-year membership draw. The draw is done each March during the Elections.

A monthly meeting draw is done following the General Meeting on the 2nd Thursday of the month.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS AND CHANGE OF CONTACT INFORMATION

You must attend either the General or Executive meeting to pay your dues. These dates are the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Thursday of each month at 7:00 pm, before the meeting starts at 7:30 pm.

There seems to be confusion as to the grace period permitted to pay dues. Hopefully this will clarify things for everyone. If your renewal date on your notice is October 1, 2021, then your membership ran from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. Your membership will lapse at the end of October, which is the one-month grace period permitted. At the end of the grace period, you are no longer a member in good standing and your name will be removed from the membership list. If you choose to rejoin the club, your name will be added to the waiting list which is currently has an estimated 4 year wait time.

It is very important that you send any and all changes in mailing address, email or phone number(s) to Val Grahl (Membership Committee). This can be done by telephone or contacting her through the club website. WOFGPA will not be responsible if your membership lapses due to incorrect contact information on our files.

All membership renewal notices are sent electronically. Only members without an email on file will receive a mailed notice.

The club will accept cheques, debit and credit card payments but not e-transfers on a scheduled meeting night starting at 7:00 pm. Mailed payments and late payments will not be accepted and will be returned to you. The caretakers, Ray and Barb will not accept membership renewals.

CANCELLED EVENTS

FALL TROUT DERBY Sat., Oct. 16

Members are not allowed to fish the pond in the morning prior to the start of the derby. Once the derby has ended, everyone is invited to fish and all regular catch limits for your membership type will apply.

Mark your calendar so you don't miss out on the first Fall Trout Derby since 2019. This derby will be held outside to accommodate physical distancing.

This year, there will be 3 tagged fish in memory of the 3 late, lifetime members: Bert Smit, George Maudsley and Hermann Szielasko. There is a cash prize associated with each tagged fish caught to the lucky angler. Please bring the tag to the attention of one of the Executive.

Registration: 7:30 am (NO EARLIER PLEASE)

Derby Times: 8:00 am until Noon
Cost: Members - \$ 15.00
Non-Members - \$ 18.00

Youth (12 & under) - \$ 5.00

The rules are really quite simple.

- 1. The longest total length of 3 Trout caught will determine the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards in each division. Of course, there will also be the Mystery Fish.
- 2. Registration includes a hot lunch with refreshments. Your name will also be entered to win one of the many door prizes.
- 3. During the derby, only registered anglers in the derby will be allowed to fish. Trout caught during the derby will count only for the derby.

Only 4 anglers are permitted on each dock to ensure 2 metre physical distancing.

The first stocking will take place on Sat. Oct. 9 around 10:00 am

MERCHANDISE

Black mask with embroidered "fish" logo. Cost is \$ 13.00 each or 2 for \$ 25.00. This item is in limited supply.

The club has pens, lanyards, T-shirts, hoodies, sweatshirts, toques, patch crests and key chains available in stock. Custom orders can be placed at any time. Current selection includes larger sized hoodies and T-shirts (sizes up to 3XL).

Lined jackets with an embroidered club crest and your name are available as custom orders only.

FISHING ETIQUETTE

Currently, the Executive have determined only 4 anglers are permitted on each dock to maintain 2 metre physical distancing.

Please do not crowd other anglers. Moving a few feet closer will not entice the fish to bite on your line instead of your neighbour's. Junior anglers find it quite intimidating to be crowded. Remember some anglers tend to need a larger area to cast. Fly-fishers are asked to cast in suitable areas and way from other anglers.

The north and the main dock have benches installed. At no time are chairs brought from home or tree stumps used on the docks. Each angler may use only one rod at a time. Culling your catch and the use of live bait is not permitted. If you are fishing on the north dock, be aware that members with boats and canoes have the right-of-way. Please stop fishing or fish elsewhere while they are taking their boat in or out of the water. All anglers in watercraft must wear properly sized PFDs.

All fish can be cleaned at the steel cleaning table by the north dock. We ask that any fish wastes be tossed into the bushes where it will be considered as the "daily delicacy" by resident wildlife. Please rinse the table thoroughly with water when you are done cleaning your catch. The water at the cleaning station is pond water and should not be used for drinking as it is not potable. When done cleaning your catch, use hand sanitizer or wash your hands thoroughly in the washroom.

Observe your daily Trout catch limits as determined by your membership type. Once your daily limit is reached, you must stop angling for the day. Record your catch in the Log book located in the small vestibule on the east side patio area. If you choose to take Black Crappie home, you are permitted to take only enough to for one meal.

HALL RENTALS

Did you know that the WOFGPA hall can be rented for your next "special" occasion for a very reasonable price? Hall rentals cover use of the hall and brick patio area but not the grounds and docks.

At this time, gathering limitations have been imposed by the Ontario government and these limits will be adhered to by WOFGPA. The hall has a maximum seating capacity of 80 persons (pre-pandemic), which makes it just the right size for a small reception, showers, meetings, Anniversary parties, Christmas parties and birthdays. The hall is available to members or their families to get together after the passing of a loved one for a "Celebration of Life". The hall offers full kitchen facilities, except dishwasher. Professional bar service is offered in the wet bar. Members receive a discount on rentals which occur on Friday or Saturday evening only.

Please contact the club caretaker, Barb at 519-681-2370 to get the low rental rates and availability of the hall.

The club hall is not available for Engagement and Stag and Doe parties or outdoor weddings and photoshoots.

UPCOMING EVENTS

Please remember that General Meetings are not held in July and August. If you have to pay your membership dues during the summer months, make sure that you attend the club at 7:00 pm on the dates provided to you by the Membership Committee.

The Executive is anticipating that our regularly scheduled functions and events will resume starting in September. The Executive and Committee Chairs will then finalize event details and it will be posted in the club newsletter, on bulletin boards and the club website.


